***Between Shades of Gray* by Ruta Sepetys**  
**Due Monday, August 28, 2017**

**Historical Background:** The global post-World War I despair and depression provided for the rise of various totalitarian regimes in the 1920s and 1930s Europe. Included in this list is Joseph Stalin, who rose to power over the Soviet Union in 1924. Stalin infamously used his secret police, the NKVD, to create fear and maintain complete control over the Soviet Union. In 1934, Stalin began his Great Purge where according to the NKVD “a staggering 1,575,000 people were detained and 681,692 were shot during 1937-1938” (Jarausch 251). In 1940, the Soviet Union annexed the Baltic States of Latvia, Estonia and Lithuania. The occupation of Lithuania, which is the homeland of the main character Lina and her family, included the forced migration of thousands of Lithuanian to labor camps in Siberia, many of whom would die of disease, exposure and starvation. In *Between Shades of Grey*, Ruta Sepetys merges the true eye-witness accounts of Lithuanian survivors into a single first person narrative that explains the hardships and struggles experienced by these persecuted people.

**Task 2:** Your task is to read the novel, *Between Shades of Gray* by Ruta Sepetys and write 3 separate journal entries from **3 different perspectives (75 points)**

1. Write three journal entries **as if you were any 3 of the minor characters**. The book is written from Lina's point of view. Your task is to highlight **3 different events from 3 different perspectives**. For example, you could write from the perspective of Lina's mother, brother and father, or from the perspective of Andrius, the bald man and the man who winds his watch. You could even write from the perspective of Kretsky or Ulyuska, as long as it is three separate individual characters. Each entry should
  - a. Consist of a 2 paragraph journal entry (**Paragraph length CP 5-7 sentences, Honors 7-9**)
  - b. Identify the speaker, location and time period (who, where, when)
  - c. Include a detailed description of the event.
  - d. Include a detailed reaction to the event from the perspective of your speakers. Think about how the character would react to Lina's actions during the event, how it would affect your character, and what their emotions would be at the time.
