- Explain how EACH piece of evidence proves your point?

### Grammar and Diction

Did you...

- Avoid using first and second person in your writing?
- Write in complete sentences?
- Vary your sentence structure so you don't have just simple or just complex sentences?
- Use appropriate vocabulary for your audience?
- Avoid repeating phrases or ideas?
